(2) Tasks

The IACC acts as Arbitration & Control Commission, recognised by IFIUS, in order to:

- Guarantee the correct development/progress of the IFIUS Games
- Guarantee that the official regulations of the concerned International Federations (FIFA/FIBA/FIVB/IGF) are respected, taking into account the adaptations and the applications of the IFIUS Laws of the Game in the different sports disciplines.
- Control the accreditation cards of the players. The IACC holds the right throughout the entire Games to carry out this control.
All participants must be active students at their university.
- Assure observation by the IACC Members that penal provisions towards a certain player are carried out correctly.

At the end of each Game day, all Commissions of the IACC will take note of the results and Referee reports. The penal provisions, taken by the IACC, will be forwarded by an IFIUS Official to the Head of the delegation of the concerned team, with a copy to the Referees and IFIUS Secretariat.

The penal decisions taken by IACC are final and definitive, without possibility of appeal.

The IACC Members wish the players all the best and express their wish that all matches of the Games are played in the spirit of "FAIR PLAY".

1.1.2. Fair Play Awards

The Fair Play Awards are awarded by the IFIUS/Panathlon Ethics committee. This committee is coordinated by a representative of Panathlon International to determine the best way to vote and select the choice.

(2) Fair Play Award Regulation



Premise

Sport is based on competition among people to establish who is the best. When such competition occurs rules shared by all competitors are enforced. **Thus, rule compliance is a basic requirement**, without which sport does not exist, no game can be played. As a consequence of this, practicing sports implies **a moral attitude** that refers to a **fundamental ethic**: competitors decide to “play” according to rules which were codified to simply establish who prevails in an open, fair match, based on the respect for ourselves and for our opponent.

Fair play is about all of us, from athletes to all members of the world the surrounds them (managers, technicians, doctors and related figures, match officials, spectators, parents). No one should even think to engage in subterfuges or dishonest acts to prevail or let someone prevail to the detriment of the opponent.

Fair Play is the soul of sport. It is the element that makes a good match out of a match, does not trigger animosity, conveys a sense of freedom and beauty of the game. It is the unwritten rule, but one that is engraved in consciences, that make sport more human.

"Panathlon International (P.I.) Fair Play Awards"
During **World Interuniversity Games**

P.I. Fair Play Award "for the gesture" to be assigned to an athlete or a team or a coach for a gesture inspired by fair play that

- Implied or could have implied risking one's victory
- Devalued one's sporting achievement.

P.I. Fair Play Award "for correctness" to the best athlete or team who shows to have most of the following elements:

- knowing how to keep himself/herself
 - o untroubled in victory and defeat, without exaggerations and violent acts;
 - o generous in forging intense and long lasting human relationships;
 - o constant in commitment, correct in the relationship with coach, managers and volunteers;
 - o ready to help team mates and support opponents;
 - o in difficult and tense moments, always able to respect the referee's decisions without objecting.

The award can similarly be addressed to the **category of spectators**, thus to the group of supporters **having reference to the University**, that gives its best support, with positive incitements, original posters, supporting songs, beguiling slogans and that, in situations of tensions, never protests, insults or generates violence.

P.I. Fair Play Award "for Promotion" (for Journalists and Medias)

In order to gratify the journalist or newspapers and local, regional or National TVs which, through article, radio and TV reports , commentaries, etc. shall make moral values of individuals, teams and public stand out, promoting the spirit of Fair Play.
